

Student Acceptable Use Policy

Acceptable use means that as a student at Catholic High School, you will promise to use the computer and those special learning tools and programs, such as the Internet, with respect. Acceptable use means you will promise to abide by all rules as set forth by your classroom teachers and the school, as well as state and federal laws. You must understand that the use of these electronic teaching and learning tools are designed to support your education.

Students MUST:

- 1) Be polite and show respect.
 - a. Communicate only in ways that are kind and respectful.
 - b. Show respect for property, others, and self. The computer and electronic resources belong to the school or the state.
 - c. Not send spam, chain letters, or other mass unsolicited mailings.
- 2) Be honest and obey the rules:
 - a. Use the computer and the Internet for appropriate educational purposes only.
 - b. Not intentionally access, transmit, copy, or create material that violates the school's code of conduct (such as messages that are obscene, threatening, rude, discriminatory, or meant to harass).
 - c. Not intentionally access, transmit, copy, or create material that is illegal (such as obscenity, stolen materials, or illegal copies of copyrighted works).
 - d. Not buy, sell, advertise, or otherwise conduct business, unless approved as a school project.
- 3) Respect and protect the intellectual property of others.
 - a. Not infringe copyrights (no making illegal copies of music, games, or movies!).
 - b. Not plagiarize.
- 4) Respect and protect the privacy of all users.
 - a. Use only assigned accounts.
 - b. Not attempt to access information or accounts you are not allowed to view.
 - c. Not transmit personal information or information of others over the Internet such as home address, phone numbers, passwords, personal photos, or Social Security numbers.
- 5) Respect and protect the integrity, availability, and security of all electronic resources.
 - a. Observe all network security practices as posted.
 - b. Report security risks or violations to a teacher or network administrator.
 - c. Not destroy or damage data, networks, or other resources that do not belong to you.
 - d. Conserve, protect, and share these resources with other students and Internet users.
 - e. Report threatening or discomfoting materials to a teacher.

Consequences:

- Suspension of all school technology resources for two weeks; 2-hour conduct detention
- Suspension of all school technology resources for one month; in-school suspension
- Revocation of all school technology resources for the remainder of the school year, or 5 months, depending on timing of offense; in-school suspension
- Revocation of all school technology resources for the remainder of the school year, or 5 months, depending on timing of offense; out-of-school suspension
